David Gonzalez was named the Caribbean and Central America bureau chief for *The New York Times* in July 1999 and is based in Miami. His coverage has included the post-conflict era in Central America, Haiti's political and social crisis and Cuba's adjustment to the post-Soviet world. Previously, he was the Metro Section's "About New York" columnist. He joined the newspaper in September, 1990 as Bronx Bureau Chief and Metro Religion reporter, and served as well as a general assignment reporter. Prior to that he worked for *Newsweek* from 1983 to 1990, serving as a correspondent in New York, Detroit and Miami. Among his prizes, Mr. Gonzalez's earned Columbia University's Mike Berger Award in May, 1992, for his coverage of New York City and its neighborhoods.
