After earning his BA in English at Colby College, Richard Calichman spent several years in Japan studying Japanese literature at Hiroshima University. He then was accepted into the Ph.D. program in Asian Studies at Cornell University, where his major field of study was modern Japanese literature and his minor fields premodern Japanese literature and modern Japanese history. His dissertation, completed in the year 2002, focused on the writings of the postwar Japanese Sinologist and thinker Takeuchi Yoshimi. Calichman's current research interests include modern Japanese literature and film, modern Chinese literature, philosophy and literary theory. He has two manuscripts presently being reviewed for publication, *Takeuchi Yoshimi: Displacing the West* and *The Takeuchi Yoshimi Reader*. In addition, he is at work translating and editing a volume on contemporary Japanese thought.
