## **Open Faculty Position in Biomedical Engineering**

Applications are encouraged from candidates whose background and experience fits with and will benefit from research synergies within the Department, with the biomaterials/nanotechnology/regenerative medicine and cardiovascular engineering areas of greatest interest.
