Two long-time members of the faculty, Professors Martha Weisman (Speech) and Harry Soodak (Physics), have received "Outstanding Teaching" Awards from the College. Recipients are selected by a committee of faculty, students and administrators.

Dr. Weisman, who is retiring this year, has been a member of the faculty for 30 years. A graduate of Syracuse University, she was the first woman to be promoted to full professor in the speech department

and was a pioneer instructor in the Seek program, serving as its speech coordinator since 1967.

Dr. Soodak has been a member of the physics department since 1949. An active researcher and writer, he says nevertheless that teaching has always been a primary interest. He created and teaches an introductory physics course, "The Ideas of Physics," that is designed to teach and develop an appreciation of physics and of the scientific view generally "as painlessly as possible."

Program Seeks Health Majors

A new undergraduate program in community health education to help meet the need for more minority health care professionals in New York City has been introduced at the College. Students will be trained for a wide variety of careers, ranging from health care administration to occupational health and industrial safety.

Many of the students are expected to come from the City's black, Hispanic and Asian communities, where most of the city's medicallyunderserved residents are located.

Students will take classes in health care systems, epidemiology, and related subjects, as well as mathematics, biology and chemistry. The course of study will lead to a bachelor of science degree in community health education.

Through a cooperative arrangement with Columbia University, students who successfully complete the City College degree requirements may be admitted to the graduate program of the Columbia University School of Public Health.

CCNY Is High In Exec Study
