## Minutes

- 1. The CRC started with accepting the minutes from the 07/12/21 meeting.
- 2. CRC Chair Kretzschmar introduced the first topic: defining the role and composition of the CRC in the fall. There was general discussion and debate on this topic.
  - a. With regards to purpose and scope of the CRC, it was generally agreed that the committee should review and use the goals laid out in priority #2 of the strategic plan for the CRC (<a href="https://www.ccny.cuny.edu/academicaffairs/looking-forward-strategic-plan-2019">https://www.ccny.cuny.edu/academicaffairs/looking-forward-strategic-plan-2019</a>) as a basis going forwards.
  - b. It was emphasized that the CRC is primarily an advisory committee and a place for the exchange of ideas across divisions. Any suggested courses of action may be carried out by Dean Wesson, the Provost, the President, or individual departments.
  - c. For the composition of the committee, it was generally agreed that to maintain and build bridges between STEM and SHAPE\* departments, as well as faculty and deans, the committee should continue to be comprised of a wide variety of representatives.
- 3. The discussions also touched upon the second topic, a mechanism to get faculty to recognize each other across divisions.
  - a. There were three suggested approaches for achieving this goal:
    - i. Continue to pursue the idea of "Ted Talks" given by faculty on their respective research.
    - ii. Create, maintain, and publicize a calendar of research-related talks in each division.
    - iii. Foster a social environment, such as a lunch session, for faculty to informally discuss their research with colleagues from other divisions.
- 4. Topics for future consideration:
  - a. How to communicate CRC recommendations back to respective departments
  - b. Review and discuss goals in the strategic plan for the CRC
  - c. How to translate interdepartmental exchange and understanding to the wider campus
