1. Introduction to Psychology (PSY 100) is strongly recommended. This course will be counted as part of the Flexible Common Core. The three credits needed for CCNY's major courses will then go towards the elective credits.

3. Students must take PSY 230 to transfer to CCNY under this Agreement.
4. Students must take PSY 255 to transfer to CCNY under this Agreement.

**G. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES**

- Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:*  
When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons and/or program directors.
- Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:*  
Each semester CCNY will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of enrolled BMCC students.
- Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors, websites, etc.:*  
This articulation agreement will be publicized on BMCC's website, and CCNY's website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.


