


Climate Change, Water Bankruptcy and Human Security

Dr. Kaveh Madani is currently the Director of the United Nations University Institute for Water, Environment and Health and a Research Professor at the City College of New York/CUNY-CREST Institute. Prior to this, he has held positions at Imperial College London and Henry Hart Rice Senior Fellow at the Yale University's MacMillan Center for International and Area Studies

Dr. Madani has about 15 years of interdisciplinary research and policy making experience in water management, climate change and environmental justice. He has held high-level policy making experience, including the Vice Presidency of the United Nations Environment Assembly Bureau, overseeing the world's highest-level decision-making body on the environment. He has also been involved in the negotiations over the implementation of the Paris Agreement as a lead negotiator and head of delegation. Over the last decade, Dr. Madani has served as PI/co-PI in several research projects around the world with a total funding of about 20 million dollars from NSF, EPA, NOAA, and the European Union, among others. He works at the interface of science, policy and society and has held academic positions in natural sciences, social sciences and engineering departments at the world's leading academic institutions. His research efforts primarily encompass the areas of climate change adaptation, stakeholders' engagement, environmental security, and resilient infrastructure operations. He has authored over 160 refereed articles in scholarly journals and conference proceedings and has supervised over 50 postdocs, PhD and MS students.

Becaria Guggenheim, del Cullman Center y DAAD; profesora distinguida en las universidades Georgetown, Columbia, SDSU, Cátedra Andrés Bello en NYU, Cátedra Reyes en la Sorbonne, en la Universidad Blaise Pascal de Clermont Ferrand, fue Distinguished Lecturer en City College CUNY, y es profesora en Macaulay Honors College CUNY.

Sus más recientes publicaciones son los poemas *La aguja en el pajar* (Visor, 2019), *La impropia* (Taller Martín Pescador, 2018) y la novela *El libro de Eva* (Siruela, 2021; Alfaguara, 2020), y *Lealtad alterado*, con Magali Lara (UNAM y UANL, 2022).

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

The City College of New York was founded by Townsend Harris in 1847 as the Free Academy of the City of New York. It is the first public institution of higher education in New York City and the precursor to CUNY. At a time when higher education in America was limited to children of the wealthy and privileged, CCNY was established to provide children of immigrants and the poor access to free higher education based on academic merit alone. Dr. Horace Webster, its first president, described the college as an experiment dedicated to educating “the children of the whole people.” This has remained CCNY’s unwavering mission ever since. Now, in our 170th year, the City College of New York continues to offer an ideal learning opportunity for students, providing an affordable world class education in a wide variety of disciplines.

Today, more than 15,000 students pursue undergraduate and graduate degrees in the College of Liberal Arts and Science; Bernard and Anne Spitzer School of Architecture; School of Education; Grove School of Engineering; Sophie Davis Biomedical Education/CUNY School of Medicine; and the Colin Powell School for Civic and Global Leadership. 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
