To be eligible, you must be enrolled, and in good academic standing, in a STEM Ph.D. program offered by CUNY or CCNY; you must also meet one or more of several criteria for underrepresented populations in U.S. biomedical research: (1) race and ethnicity (African American, Hispanic, American Indian, Alaska or Hawaii Native, other Pacific Islanders); (2) economic and/or educational disadvantage; (3) disability status (4) women in Engineering, Physics, or Chemistry.
