Dear Prospective Applicant:

This letter is to inform you of two important requirements regarding the application procedure to the Sophie Davis Biomedical Education Program/CUNY School of Medicine. Please read it thoroughly!

The Sophie Davis (SD) Application deadline is January 9, 2017. The application should be submitted much earlier to your college advisor for review and an electronic attachment of your transcript. To be considered for the Sophie Davis/CUNY School of Medicine, each applicant must submit a high school transcript, SAT I, and ACT scores by the deadline date. Be sure to check with your college advisor/counselor about their preferred deadlines for submission of your completed application to them.

In addition to the supplemental Sophie Davis application, you must also submit a general CUNY application with the City College choice and the Sophie Davis School of Biomedical Education Curriculum (0179) as one of your choices. The CUNY application must be completed online. To apply go to www.cuny.edu/apply. If you are also applying to Macaulay Honors College, submit both an Honors application and a Sophie Davis application.

All Sophie Davis/CUNY School of Medicine admission notifications and decisions will be sent from the Sophie Davis Biomedical Education Program/CUNY School of Medicine Office of Admission on Sophie Davis letterhead by April 1, 2017. Notification from CUNY is separate. The City College Admissions Office may accept you before we send official correspondence about the Sophie Davis admissions decision. If you are interested in taking the ACT exam that we administer, please read these instructions:

REPORT FOR TESTING

Date: Saturday, December 17, 2016 (general ACT Exam Day)
Wednesday, January 4, 2017 (reserved for Sabbath observers)
Time: 8:00 A.M. (each date)
Place: Lobby of the Robert E. Marshak Science Building
(enter the building on Convent Avenue between 137th and 138th Streets)

BRING WITH YOU

1. This letter
2. Your social security Number
3. A ball point pen and several #2 pencils
4. A four-function, scientific or graphing calculator
5. A photo ID (no one will be permitted without a valid photo ID)

If you have taken the ACT examination, it is your responsibility to submit the scores by our deadline. You can retake the ACT exam with us only if you meet the following criteria:

- a) The previous ACT was not a residual exam (an exam given on a non-national test date).
- b) You have not taken the ACT exam within 60 days prior to the ACT exam date with us.

Please note: ACT residual testing rules do not permit the scores from this exam to be used for applications to other colleges.

To register for the ACT exam visit your SD VIP Page at <http://med.cuny.edu>. Students can register for the ACT exam between November 18th and December 16th. Sabbath observers can also log on to register for the Wednesday, January 4, 2017 test date. You will be exempt from the ACT only if you submit sufficient proof that you have taken the test no longer than a year prior to December 18, 2016.

The ACT testing will be completed by approximately 2:00 p.m.

Your application will be considered only if you have completed this examination. Rescheduling testing for Sabbath and non-Sabbath observers may not be possible, especially since **the application deadline is January 9, 2017.**
