

Take the **#1 train** local to 137th Street and Broadway. Walk up 138th Street three blocks to Convent Avenue (for Marshak Building); down Convent Avenue to 133rd Street, then follow paved path up a small slope to the large glass structure (CDI Building).

Take the **A or D express, or the "B" or "C" local** to either 125th street (north exit is at 127th Street) or 135th Street and St. Nicholas Avenue, then walk up the hill. ASRC is nearest the park; CDI Building is just east of ASRC.
