Espace Associatif- Rabat is a Moroccan association devoted to strengthening the capacity of CSOs to be a key player in the democratic development, The Associative Space initiates Care International in partnership with Morocco and with the support of the European Union, the project "Local Governance and rights of women. "promote and help other associations' development. Founded in 1996, some of the association's specific objectives include working with other advocates of democracy and helping them to strengthen their resources, strategies, and involvement in their relevant fields.

Category: NGO Capacity Building

Community service students duties: Community service students will join a team of 7 people from the association and will work in direct contact with the association's coordinator. Community service students will be working on administrative tasks such as website editing, revision and updating as well as archival work. You should be also able to write and speak French.

Association Marocaine de Panification Familiale (Rabat)

Women's health and family planning (AMPF) was established in 1971 by the Honorary Princess Lalla Fatima Zahra Al Azizia. Since 2008, Her Royal Highness has run the association, which seeks to spread information and awareness about the benefits of birth control and family planning. This association seeks to promote the basic and universal human right to health by improving Moroccan citizens' sexual and reproductive health. Moreover, this association advocates on behalf of young people by defending their right to make informed decisions regarding their sexual health. AMPF also strives for gender equality and mutual empowerment by fighting discrimination and violence. Additionally, the AMPF has taken steps to prevent unsafe abortions and the spread of STIs, STDs, and HIV/AIDS.

Category: NGO Capacity Building

Community service student duties: Community service students will work on this organization's website, Facebook page, and additional social media and reports. Community service students should also be able to speak French.

L'Organization Panafricaine de Lutte Contre le SIDA (OPALS) is committed to the fight against AIDS. OPALS provide medical and psychological support and care for people with HIV and AIDS. Moreover, OPALS advocates on behalf of these people and fights discrimination against people living with AIDS. The association consists of several groups of staff members including 38 executives, 19 technicians, and 8 service agents. All three of these employee groups consist of both men and women. Members of OPALS engage in medical care and check-ups as well as administrative work.

Category: NGO Capacity Building
Community service student duties: Community service students will be present during patients' medical checkups with doctors, work on data archiving and website development.

Center for Studies and Research on Women in Islam aims to examine and interpret the Quran, Shar'ia Law, and the rights of women in Islam through a tolerant, feminist lens. This organization promotes scientific research in Islamic studies as a means of contributing to the enrichment of Islamic heritage and to the resolution of women's issues. This organization strives to show the diverse cultural, social, and historical development of women in the Muslim world while emphasizing the equality and mutual respect between the sexes embedded in the Quran. The center's other specific goals include the improvement of how women are perceived and treated in the realm of Islamic jurisprudence and the examination of the role and status of women in Islam in light of ongoing, modern social changes.

Category: NGO Capacity Building

Community service student duties: Community service student will work with a group of 6 employees from the Centre, most of who are women. Volunteers will proofread documents, identify information resources, and update the centre's website and social media page. Community service students should feel comfortable using a computer and social media and should have online research skills. Community service students with computer science skills and/or any background in and knowledge of Islam are encouraged to select this project.

Le Centre Social pour Personnes Agées (The Social Center for the Elderly People) (Rabat) exists to promote the social, physical, and psychological wellbeing of abandoned elderly people who are 60 years old and over. The centre was founded in 2008, and, today, hosts approximately 50 abandoned elderly people, both men and women.

Category: Social Welfare

Community service student duties: Community service students will assist the social assistants working in the centre and spend their time with a group of elderly people living at the centre. Community service students will look after these elderly people. Most of the people who work at the centre speak only Arabic and some French; thus, it is suggested that community service students have some Arabic skills, or, that they have patience and confidence in their abilities to communicate in a new language.

Women's issues/ Feminine Pluriel (Plural Feminine)-Rabat: is an association that aims to strengthen the status of women by educating them. FémininePluriel also promotes respect for and the embracing of women in society. The NGO aims at promoting women's integration and participating in social life and enrich their empowerment.

Al Mostaqbal Association for Education and Vocational Initiation with special needs.

The association opened the doors of its centres in the town Yacoub El Mansour in Rabat Created On April 10, 2003, The association AL Mostaqbal Rabat, Morocco

provides assistance to people with mental disabilities (type trisomy 21), as well as academic support, and professional initiation of disabled people in Rabat. It supports children with disabilities who have left integrated classes after the age of 18, and teens not in school disabled, ensuring psychological counselling and speech that meets their specific needs.

Category: Working with disabled children

Community service student duties: Community service students will do some activities with children with disabilities in different workshops.

<u>Amal Sale</u> Association is the host organization. It is a non-profit Moroccan organization (NGO) established in 2002 that is located in Sale. Its main focus is teaching foreign languages (French and English) and organizing trips for disadvantaged children between 5-13 years old and also adolescents from 13 to 18 years. Also, computer science; off shoring and other workshops.

Category: teaching English and NGO Capacity building

Community service student duties: Community service students in this project will teach English youngsters from the neighbourhood. Their age varies from 15 to 22 and beyond. Also you are welcomed to take part in any other workshops they organize such as Theatre and Music. Service learner can do the capacity building when the students are out for trainings.

Youth Takadom Association is a non-profit Moroccan organization that was established in 2002. Located in a popular neighbourhood in Rabat, Youth Takadom's main goal is to enrich the lives of children with socioeconomic disadvantages. Youth Takadom's main projects involve providing foreign language (French and English) classes and organizing trips and activities. Youth Takadom's participants consist mainly of disadvantaged children and adolescents between the ages of 5-18 years old. Youth Takadom will also work with children under 5-years-old, and, in the evenings, the organization provides English and French classes for adults.

<u>Community service student duties</u>: Community service students with this organization, you will teach English to small kids from the neighborhood.



<u>Orient-Occident- Rabat</u> is an organization devoted to providing the less fortunate with an institution where they can learn, share information, and receive professional training. Established in 1994, Orient-Occident Rabat also seeks to promote cultures, both those of Morocco and those abroad. Consequently, the organization opened its board of directors to citizens of other countries with the hope of facilitating international dialogue and fostering mutual understanding and respect between different countries. Ultimately, the Orient-Occident strives to serve as a resource for Moroccans as well as a bridge between the two shores of the Mediterranean Sea where identities meet, recognize each other, and prepare for their future together.

Community service students Duties: Service learner will teach English to local Moroccans.

<u>Bladi Association (Salé)</u> is the host organization. It is a non-profit Moroccan organization (NGO) established in 2002. Bladi is located in a popular neighbourhood in Sale. Its main focus is teaching foreign languages (French and English) and organizing trips for disadvantaged children between 5-13 years old and also adolescents from 13 to 18 years.

Category: Teaching English
Community service students duties: As community service students in this project, you will teach English to kids from the neighborhood. Their age varies from 5 to 12 and beyond. Also you are welcomed to take part in any other workshops they organize such as Theatre and Music. You can also do some fun activities with the kids.

Association Atofoula Saida is an association devoted to help children with disabilities. Founded recently which pays special attention to those living with mental and physical disabilities. It helps them to develop their skills through different workshops such us therapy, drawing, painting and singing with small kids. The association is located in a popular neighborhood in Sale and it has an annex that works with small kids from 2 years to 5 years for pre-schooling classes.

Association Attadamon is an association that is located in a popular area aims at promoting the youth skills through different workshops mainly, aesthetics and sewing and cooking classes to develop their skills and help them get involved in the social practice. Strengthening those capacities, the association offers language classes to promote the youth communication skills.

Association Rowad Attanmia is an organization that to promote social and cultural development through a variety of workshops and indoor and outdoor activities for youngsters interested in learning foreign languages and organizing trips, visits to different rural areas for the sensibilities of the environment, the women empowerment, conferences about youth issues, educational (fighting illiteracy and non formal education), social and cultural activities, camping's for small kids during summer.
