The Colin Powell Fellowship in Leadership and Public Service UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT APPLICATION FORM (2017 – 2019)

The Colin Powell Fellowship in Leadership and Public Service is a two-year intensive, multifaceted program for undergraduate students. The experience is designed to prepare fellows for lives in public service and active citizenship and to enable them to apply their skills to issues of public concern. As a Colin Powell Fellow you will acquire a broad knowledge of political institutions and the policy-making process and learn about public service careers and opportunities. Fellows also explore leadership development and methods for creating social change.

Support

The fellowship provides substantial scholarship support (between \$10,000 and \$12,000 annually) for two years (assuming students remain in good standing). The fellowship also provides a stipend to support students who participate in a public service-related summer internship.

Program

The fellowship consists of four components: a weekly seminar, a public-service related internship, professional development and a Capstone Project.

<u>Seminar</u>

Undergraduate Powell Fellows participate in a weekly seminar for two full academic years. The seminar serves as a broad introduction to the program's key themes: leadership, public service, and teamwork. Through the seminar, students explore the concept of public service, foundations of the policymaking process, the emergence of philanthropic and non-profit organizations, traditions of American volunteerism, and the possibilities for future careers in public service. Students also identify, in themselves and in others, the markers of successful leadership and teamwork. Seminars are Tuesdays from 5:30 PM to 7:00PM during the Fall and Spring semesters and participation is mandatory. Students earn three academic credits per year and should expect to commit between eight and ten hours per week on seminars, research, service, and additional programming.

Summer Internship

As an undergraduate fellow, you will participate in a summer internship between your first and second year. We'll work with you to find appropriate internships that bridge between your academic and career interests as well as the learning goals of the Powell Fellowship. Fellows who participate in full-time, unpaid internships in a non-profit or government agency, for a period of 8-12 weeks, receive funding for their summer work.

Professional Development

Both while you're in the program and once you're an alumnus, we help you with professional development including workshops on resume writing, interviewing and job searches.

Capstone Project

In your second year as a fellow, you will work on a culminating capstone project grounded in participatory action research methodology. The project requires fellows to collaborate in small teams and draw upon the skills knowledge and experiences acquired during their time in the fellowship program. Over the course of the year, fellows will complete fieldwork, conduct expert interviews, work alongside community partners, analyze data, conduct presentations and submit a final report.

Completed applications must include: an application form, a personal, statement, two essays, two letters of recommendation, a resume and a transcript. Completed applications are due Monday, March 6, 2017 by 4:00 PM. If your application is missing any of the required materials it will be marked incomplete, and we will not be able to proceed with our review. You can apply regardless of citizenship status.

Applications must be submitted BOTH digitally and in hard copy. Pay careful attention to the instructions on the following pages. Orientation will take place the week before classes begin and participation is mandatory.

Digital copies of the application should be uploaded by 4: 00PM, Monday, March 6, 2017 using the City College Scholarship Application Portal.

The Colin Powell Fellowship in Leadership and Public Service APPLICATION FORM: RESUME, PERSONAL STATEMENT AND ESSAYS

You are required to submit your resume, one personal statement and two essays, responding to the questions below. Your essays should be typed, double-spaced in Times New Roman (or similar) font. Type your name at the top of each essay page. Please use the included pages to type your essays.

- Resume (should not exceed one page)
- Personal Statement (250 words or less):
 - Please state your scholarly interests and experiences at CCNY and any career goals as they relate to public policy and/or public service.
- Essay 1 (750 words or less):
 - Describe a successful leader you know and admire (e.g. a person in your own community, your family or a well-known public figure.) Discuss the characteristics and qualities that make this person an effective leader. Describe how this person has applied these characteristics in addressing a specific leadership challenge.
- Essay 2 (750 words or less):
 - Address ONE of the following:
 - 1. Describe a service or volunteer project in which you have participated. Include details about the organization for which you worked and/or the service you provided to the community. In your view, what were the root causes of the problem that you were trying to address (i.e. why was there a need for your service in the community?) What recommendations would you provide to the organization, the community or to public officials to address the problem?

2. Describe an issue or problem facing the world about which you feel passionately. Write about why you think the problem exists and what kinds of solutions you might recommend to policy-makers or service providers to address the problem.

The Colin Powell Fellowship in Leadership and Public Service APPLICATION FORM: LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

You are required to submit two letters of recommendation. At least one letter should come from a professor who knows you well. The second letter can be written by another member of the faculty or someone who knows you in a different capacity (e.g. a work or volunteer supervisor, high school guidance counselor or teacher, etc.).

Letters should be submitted in sealed envelopes with your application, and the recommender can either email the letter to Anasa Scott aiscott@ccny.cuny.edu or give you the letter in a sealed envelope with signature on the seal, which you can bring to our office. You do NOT need to upload the letters online.

You should provide your recommendation writers with a recommendation form available on the next page. We strongly suggest that you provide each recommender with the first page of this application, a copy of each of the essays you are submitting, and a copy of your resume. This will ensure that your recommender is well informed about the nature of the program, as well as your interests, accomplishments, and goals.
