Advanced Certificate: Teacher of Young Children with Special Needs Early Childhood – Birth-Grade 2

The Teacher of Young Children with Special Needs Early Childhood – Birth-Grade 2 Advanced Certification Program seeks to produce professionals who are equipped with the understandings and skills to work in a variety of roles (early intervention, SEIT, or classroom teacher) with young children in the full range of development in general, inclusive or special education (Infants/toddlers, Pre K, Kindergarten, 1st or 2nd grade). In this program participants will engage diverse learners in active, experiential learning, meeting their needs by building on children's strengths and interests while addressing their challenges. Through studying the ongoing cycle of observation, assessment and instructional planning, participants will be able to help young children with varying abilities realize their full educational potential. Participants will learn to understand the relationships among culture, language and learning in families and to support growth and learning of the whole child in the context of family and community. They will also learn the terminology, practices, and assessments commonly used in the field of educating children with special needs.

Program Admission Requirements

There are two advanced certificates designed to serve candidates who come from different backgrounds of preparation:

Adv. Cert Courses for ECE/CE/BCE Certified is for teachers who already possess initial, provisional, permanent, or professional certification as a classroom teacher at the early childhood (birth – grade 2) level, childhood education (1st – 6th grade), and/or bilingual childhood education (1st – 6th grade). The 12-18 credit program (up to 6 of the 18 credits can be waived if a transcript review indicates the candidate has taken a comparable course) leads to NYS certification in teaching students with disabilities (birth – grade 2). This program does not lead to a degree.

Adv. Cert Courses SPED Certified is for teachers who already possess initial, provisional, permanent, or professional certification as a classroom teacher for students with disabilities (1-6 grade). The 12-18 credit program (up to 6 of the 18 credits can be waived if a transcript review indicates the candidate has taken a comparable course) leads to certification. This program does not lead to a degree.

Both streams address the principles of developmentally-appropriate practice articulated by the National Association for the Education of Young Children and the Council for Exceptional Children (CEC) standards for teachers of students with mild to moderate exceptional learning needs. Anchored in theory and research, the program provides teachers with an understanding of

- evidence-based classroom practices
- use of new technologies
- legal and ethical issues
- knowledge of assessment tools, practices and applications
- individualized and universal design for learning instruction
- effective Individualized Education Program (IEP) development
- culturally and developmentally responsive approaches to diverse learners.
